


Hello Everyone, hope you are all in good spirits – certainly talking to some of the Presidents, I am assured that we are doing well!!

News from the International Scout and Guide Fellowship (ISGF) 29th ISGF World Conference 2020 postponed

Dear Friends, Warm Greetings from the ISGF World Committee and the World Bureau. We are facing a health crisis unlike any in the 75-year history. The COVID-19 Pandemic has rapidly covered the globe according to the last updates.

There are many activities, projects and games that we can do online to continue promoting our bounds of friendship and to help others. As Adult Scouts and Guides our creativity is our best resource. ISGF members around the world can have meetings online, using Skype, Go to meeting, Jit.si Meet, Instagram, WhatsApp, Facebook, and many other applications.

Just a thought – bed socks... for the 75 year challenge... (thanks to May issue Qld TG Chatter)

Some craft ideas now winter is approaching.

BED SOCKS

1 X 50 GRAM BALL 8 PLY WOOL

1 PR. NO. 7 NEEDLES

Cast on 90 sts. Knit 20 rows in garter st.

Now using stocking st. knit 41, K2tog, K4, sl.1 K1 psso, K41.

Next row: Purl 40 sts, P2 tog. Into back of sts, P4, P2 tog., P40.

Continue decreasing every row, decreasing 1 st. each side of instep until 48 sts remain.

Then K1, *make 1, K2 tog., K2 * repeat from * to * to end for eyelets.

Next row: Purl.

Then knit 12 rows K2, P2 rib and cast off in rib.

Sew up back seam and sole of foot using a flat seam. Make crochet cord or thread ribbon through eyelets.
