PRIVATE PROPERTY CHECKLIST

As required by Policy No GO. 30 "Meeting in Homes and Private Property," a private property to be used for overnight stays or camps must be approved by the Region Assessment Team in which the site is located.

The Region Assessment Team (R.A.T.) must consist of:

- Region Manager or her designate
- A qualified adult Leader

1 member of the R.A.T. must hold an appropriate qualification. For a property used for a residential event this must be the relevant indoor or outdoor Guide camping qualification.

All private property must be assessed and re-approved every 3 years.

Note: All Australian Camps Association accredited established campsites are exempt from this assessment. See www.auscamps.asn.au

Within 14 days of the Private Property Checklist being completed, please forward one copy to JPC and retain a second copy in the Region. A JPC staff member will then notify the Region Manager if the site is approved for use.
