



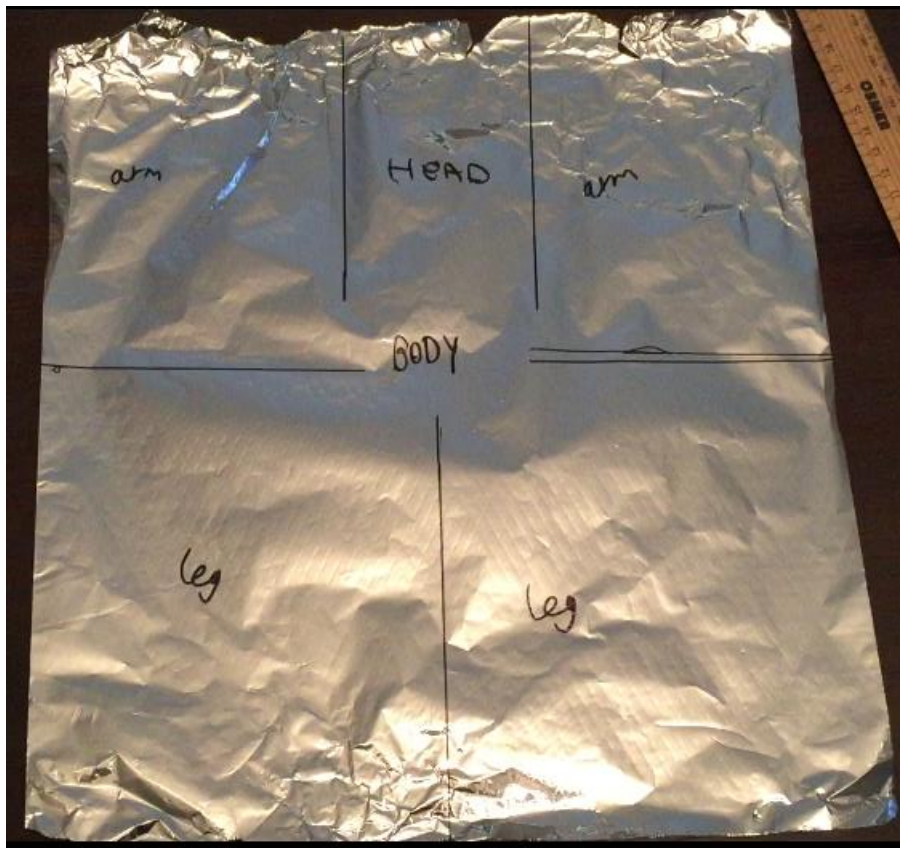
Tin Foil Campsite

What you need:

- Foil
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Marker

Instructions:

1. Cut a piece of foil 30cm long.
2. Mark out your foil with lines for head, arms, and legs.



3. Cut along the lines you've drawn. Don't cut too far in to the middle, or your limbs will fall off!
4. Scrunch each section into a body part. Don't worry if it's a bit messy, you'll be able to tidy it up at the end.
5. If your figure looks a bit like an alien, take some extra foil, wrap it around the body, and shape it to look more human (unless you want it to look like an alien!)
6. Bend the ends of your limbs to make hands and feet.

7. To make a tent: take a strip of foil about 5-10cm wide and scrunch it into a long piece.
8. Repeat twice so that you have three “tent poles”. Two should be about 20cm long, and one about 15cm.
9. Take your two longer “poles” and fold them in half, making two triangles.
10. Join your shorter “pole” to the points of the two triangles to make a tent structure. Fold the foil over and squish it to join them together.
11. For your tent canvas: tear off a big square of foil and fold it in half, then in half again. Unfold it once, making sure that there’s a clear centre ridge marked on your foil – this will line up with your “ridge pole” (the short pole connecting your triangles).
12. With the “canvas” lying on your table, place the tent frame down upside down so that the “ridge pole” lines up with the folded ridge.
13. Let your frame fall to one side, and fold the edges of the “canvas” foil around the tent frame to secure it.
14. Repeat with the other side of the tent frame, so that the canvas is secured to the frame.
15. Turn it the right way up and admire your beautiful tent!

You can arrange your campsite however you like. What other camp essentials can you make?
