



Acknowledgement Plaque

You will need:

- A brick or flat stone
- Markers to decorate
- Information about who the traditional custodians of the land around you are

Instructions:

1. An Acknowledgement Plaque pays respects to the traditional custodians of the land. Do you know who that is for the area your Guide Hall or meeting place?
2. Using your markers, you might like to draw the Aboriginal flag. Can you find out what the colours represent?
3. Choose the words you would like for your plaque. One example is *“As you walk your next step, remember the Aboriginal people who first walked this land.”*
4. If you know who the traditional custodians of the land are, make sure you acknowledge them.
5. The next time you can go to your Hall, display your Acknowledgement Plaque proudly and prominently at your Guide Hall or meeting place.
