

## **BOOT PLANTER FOR GARDEN**

## **Materials**

- Old boots (gumboots or work boots)
- Potting soil
- Plants (from a nursery/garden centre, or cuttings from your garden)
- Drill or hammer and large nails (to make drainage holes with adult supervision)

## Instructions

- 1. Remove and throw away the insoles of the boots.
- 2. Ask for an adult's help, permission, or supervision to drill or hammer some holes in the bottom of the boots to allow for water drainage.
- 3. With boots sitting upright, fill with potting soil to about halfway up, making sure to get the soil in the toes as well.
- 4. Make a small indentation in the soil in each boot the size of your plant's root ball.
- 5. Carefully remove the plant from its plastic pot (or take your plant cutting) and place in the indentation in the soil.
- 6. Fill with soil around the plant up to the top of the boot.
- 7. Water the plants thoroughly.
- 8. Display your boot planters in the garden.
