



Reusable Face Wipes

Make your own reusable face wipes to replace single use cotton rounds! Reusable wipes are much more environmentally friendly, as they don't contribute to landfill. Use them to cleanse your face, apply moisturiser, or even remove nail polish. Make face wipes for yourself, or give them away as gifts.

You will need:

- Scrap fabric: flannelette, fleece, jersey, light cotton
- Scissors
- Pins
- Sewing machine
- Thread and matching bobbin
- Compass (or round object) for making a circle
- Paper to make template
- Pen/pencil

Instructions:

1. Use compass to draw a circle on a piece of paper with a diameter of around 7cm, or find an object of a similar size to trace around. You can also make squares that are 7cm x 7cm. Feel free to adjust the size to suit your preference.
2. Cut it out to use as a template when cutting your fabric pieces.
3. Place template onto your fabric and cut out 2 pieces for each face wipe. You can use a pin to hold the template in place when cutting the fabric, or draw around it.



- Put one piece onto the other, with wrong sides touching and the good sides of the fabric facing out.
- Place some pins to hold fabric together to prepare for sewing.



- Thread your sewing machine and use a zig zag stitch to sew your two pieces of fabric together, sewing close to the edge to enclose the fabric. Make sure to backstitch so your stitches don't come undone!



- Clip the threads to finish it off. Don't forget to remove the pins!
- Simply wash the face wipes between uses to keep them clean and hygienic.
