More about the Fish Creek Tea Cosy Festival – Cheryl Bertrand: The Lady Nelson Golden Wattle Trefoil Guild travelled to Fish Creek to see the Tea Cosy Festival, held in the community hall and to meet with the Strzelecki Boomerang Trefoil Guild.

There were a great variety of cosies – some from Overseas and Interstate. The festival is very popular and is usually held every two years.

All age groups were represented – from the Fish Creek Junior School exhibit made from sticks and twigs attached to a large aluminium pot (those who have ever done catering for guide functions will recognize this) to many knitted in various colours, shapes and sizes (by both male and female knitters). My prize went for a knitted cat, which had a very malevolent expression.

We drove past the Guinness prize entry of the largest cosy, situated at the old railway station.

Lunch was at the Fish Creek Hotel – the Fishy; the large fish, which sits on top of the roof, was out for repairs. We had a meal inside while the fire keep out the cold rain. It was lovely to catch up with Linda Hall (Brown Owl) and the other ladies whom I haven't seen for some time.

Queen Elizabeth loves chocolate biscuit cake. It is the perfect mid-afternoon sweet treat.

This chocolate biscuit cake recipe is a no-cook cake made with mostly store cupboard essentials, including crushed biscuits, butter, sugar and cocoa powder with the addition of walnuts and raisins. The only fresh ingredients you'll need are butter and milk, so it's the ideal go-to treat. As this chocolate biscuit cake recipe is enough for 16 portions, it also makes it a great choice for parties, picnics and even a daily snack if you're feeling indulgent. You could make it healthier by swapping the full fat butter for a lower calorie option, full-fat milk for skim or a dairy-free alternative, and replacing the golden syrup with honey.

Ingredients:

•125g (4oz) butter •60g (2oz) caster sugar •2 tbsp cocoa powder •2 tbsp golden syrup •2 tbsp milk •250g (8oz) arrowroot biscuit, or any plain biscuits like a digestive, or a mixture, roughly crushed (in a bag, bashing with a rolling pin) •60g (2oz) walnuts pieces, chopped •60g (2oz) raisins •1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract, optional •18cm (7in) square cake tin, lined with bakewell paper

Method •Put the butter, sugar, cocoa, syrup and milk in a pan and heat gently, stirring until melted together to make a chocolate sauce. •Add the crushed biscuits, walnuts, raisins and vanilla, if using, and press the mixture into the tin. Chill in the fridge until set firm. Cut into squares.

Tip for making chocolate biscuit cake: Drizzle melted white chocolate over the top for a finishing touch. Enjoy!

She joined 10th Ballarat (Scot's Church) Guides when she turned 11 yrs old and continued going to Guides even after she started working in an office. During World War II she ran a Cub Pack at Ballarat YMCA.

After her marriage she joined Trefoil Guild and encouraged her children and grandchildren to join Guides and Scouts. Her daughter became a Queen's Guide, her son, a Sea Scout and her granddaughter gained her B-P Award and is now a very active Cub Leader in Upper Beaconsfield.

As far as we know, Joan is the oldest Guide in Ballarat. A few years ago, she visited Scot's Church Hall, where my unit meets, and told the girls where her patrol corner was in 1930's. She then told them about Guiding in her



day. Our girls could not believe that a lady, who was soooooo old enjoyed doing the same things as they do.

Joan remained an active member of 1st Ballarat Trefoil Guild until it disbanded due to most members dying and the others becoming too old to continue. Joan was one of the younger ones!

Her family have asked if she could receive a special message from Trefoil Guild as it was an important part of her life. She really enjoyed travelling overseas to various Trefoil Gatherings and to other meetings and conferences interstate, hence this email.
