Thank you for the last few years. It must be great to meet so many but tiring too.




The entertainment has been booked and it will leave you in stitches!! You will have to come along to discover what is in store for our special dinner.

Gone Home – Shirley Kidd – Acacia Trefoil Guild : 8th Feb 1934 – 29th March 2022

Shirley began her Guiding life with her dear friend, Cathy Clark when their daughters wished to become Brownies. They became Leaders at Forest Hill and attended the first of many training sessions.

Later they qualified as First Aiders, and attained their Camp Qualification, eventually taking a sub camp of 16 girls at a State Camp.

They were invited to participate in the training of new Guiders and to aim for their Trainer's Certificate. Shirley was also a valued member of the then Maroondah Region as an assessor for Camp Qualifications.

When Shirley's daughter, Rowena became Gumnut Leader at Croydon, she asked her Mother to join her. Shirley agreed and assisted Rowena for 2 years.



Shirley joined Acacia Trefoil Guild in 2006 and we have enjoyed her company since that day.

As a member of OB-PS she travelled internationally and supported the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts through OB-PS. Norma was a kind, generous, lovely lady and a keen supporter of Guiding. Kinta members will miss her greatly.

Vale Muriel Burns: 102 years. 9 months young

Goulburn Valley Trefoil Guild has lost a most gracious lady. Muriel was a member of Guiding in Shepparton for over 80 years. She joined brownies at the age of seven in 1926 and then continuing on to guides in 1930 at the age of 11. She was a guide when our guide hall was opened in 1936, and was an escort of the Colour Party at this significant event

Muriel was a much member, still attending meetings at 101½ years, before shifting to Ferntree Gully to live with her daughter Margaret, as she then required extra assistance at home.

Muriel, via zoom officially cut our 60th birthday cake last year and drank a toast to our Trefoil Guild. She was still receiving notices and newsletters from our Guild, and often offered suggestions about topics of discussion.
