JANE SYDENHAM-CLARKE Co-founder and CEO Foundation Nova Diem

Jane's contributions have been widely acknowledged including in The Australian's 2022 Top 100 Innovators list. As co-founder and CEO of 'Foundation Nova Diem', she is driven to unlock potential and break down barriers for a more equitable and inclusive world.

A strategic and hands on leader, Jane brings experience across government, commercial and not-for-profit sectors. She was most recently CEO of think tank 'Food Frontier', and previously CEO of 'Skyline Education Foundation Australia' and 'Freemasons Victoria.' She has held c-suite roles at Federation Square, Southgate Arts and Leisure Precinct, Kidney Health Australia and VicHealth.

Jane initially trained as a registered general nurse and in post graduate mental health. With Masters and Honours degrees from Monash University and as a graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and Leadership Victoria, she has been appointed to various community leadership positions on Boards and Committees – as Chair of Tradeswomen Australia, Vice Chair of the Victorian Tourism Awards and as a member of the BHERT (Business Higher Education Round Table) and Engagement Awards Judges Panels. She is currently a director of Urban Camp.

Megumi Miki 'Quietly Powerful'



As a Consultant in Leadership, Culture and Diversity and Inclusion, Megumi brings together her 20 years' experience and practical knowledge of business strategy, finance, leadership, organisational development and culture change. She also draws on her Japanese and Australian upbringing, own successes and challenges and indepth discussions with 40+ Quietly Power leaders. She shared a little about her life in a <u>2020 keynote speech</u>.

Megumi started the <u>Quietly Powerful</u> movement in August 2016 to help quieter professionals to thrive on their own terms and expand the definition of what good leadership looks like.

The book 'Quietly Powerful: How your quiet nature is your hidden leadership strength' received the Australian Career Book Award for 2020 by RSA Oceania and Best Leadership Book of 2020 by the Australian Business Book Awards.

As a quieter professional herself, she has and continues to invest in herself to become a better version of herself. She believes that working on herself makes the biggest difference in her leadership effectiveness and influence.

While many people know what is needed to realise their own and others' potential, few have reinforced the knowledge to bring change into everyday action. With Megumi's programs, behaviour change principles are embedded into every exercise, workshop, and assessment.
